



## Article Notification pursuant to the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals (GHS)

Safety Data Sheets (SDS) have not been prepared for DuraVinyl products as they are considered to be “articles”. As such, they are not subject to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration’s Hazard Communication Standard (29 CFR 1910.1200(b)(6)(v)). This standard defines an “article” as a manufactured item other than a fluid or particle:

- (i) Which is formed to a specific shape or design during manufacture;
- (ii) Which has end use function(s) dependent in whole or in part upon its shape or design during end use;
- (iii) Which under normal conditions of use does not release more than very small quantities (minute or trace amounts) of a hazardous chemical, and does not pose a physical or health risk to employees.

Quality Media’s products, when used under reasonable conditions and in accordance with the directions for use, should not present health hazards. Use or processing of products in a manner not in accordance with the products’ directions for use may affect the performance of the products and may present potential health and safety hazards.
